-TSUNAMI-

Tsunami is one of the largest natural disasters in the world. That can affect human lives as well as natural resources, etc. Simply Giant waves known as tsunamis are brought on by earthquakes or underwater volcanic eruptions. The height of tsunami waves does not substantially rise as they approach the ocean's depths. Yet, as the waves move inland, the ocean's depth declines, causing them to rise to ever-higher heights. Rather than the distance from the wave's source, the speed of tsunami waves is determined by the depth of the ocean.



Across deep waters, tsunami waves may move as quickly as jets, only slowing down when they encounter shallow waters. Oceanographers advise against calling tsunamis "tidal waves" because the tides have little to do with these enormous waves. The tsunami destroys human populations, homes, buildings, and ports in addition to destroying beaches, trees, and vegetation.



A sudden, swift decline in water levels below the predicted low tide is a more perilous and urgent indication of an impending tsunami. This can happen minutes before a tsunami hits the shoreline and may be the only indication along coastlines that are too far from the epicentre to feel the shaking. A tsunami can potentially happen with little to no notice. A tsunami can potentially happen with little to no notice. Seismologists from Natural Resources Canada keep a constant eye out for such occurrences. A tsunami warning is immediately sent to the media and municipalities in areas where, a tsunami is likely to occur. Marine Communications Traffic Services of





the Canadian Coast Guard sends tsunami warnings to seafarers. If there is time after receiving a tsunami warning, moving to higher ground as soon as possible can avoid this disaster.

Sri Lanka was one of the countries struck by the tsunami resulting from the Indian Ocean earthquake on December 26, 2004, which was exactly after Christmas


and Poya day. On January 3, 2005, Sri Lankan authorities reported 30,000+ confirmed deaths. This can be considered as one of the most tragedic natural disasters we have ever faced as Sri Lankans.

THE BLIND & DEAF AUTHOR OF THE 20TH CENTURY

-"The only thing worse than being

blind is having sight but no vision "-

Helen Keller was a major humanitarian, educator, and writer of the 20th century who advocated for deaf and blind people as well as women's suffrage, labour rights, and world peace, and co-founded the American Civil Liberties Union. Born on June 27, 1880, in Tuscumbia, Alabama, this remarkable woman was born without any disease but became blind and hearing impaired at 19 months. Although she had to face this condition due to a disease known as 'brain fever', she did not let it hinder her and since she was 7 years old, she has developed a way to communicate with her family. She was then referred to Anne Sullivan as her teacher and mentor. Since then she has started studying Braille and various other methods. She was a writer before receiving her Bachelor of Arts degree from Radcliffe College, Cambridge in 1904. She published two works, The story of my life in 1902 and Optimism in 1903. Accordingly, she became the first person who was deaf and blind to earn a College degree. She also received honorary doctorates from Glasgow, Harvard, and Temple universities.

She worked for the American Foundation for the Blind (AFB) from 1924 to 1968 and was instrumental in raising funds for the foundation. In addition, she has travelled to 35 countries around the world to advocate for blind people. She has also written many articles on blindness for major magazines. The country, McClure's and The Atlantic monthly are some of them. In addition, she has written many books such as The open door, Out of the dark, Light in my darkness, The



world I live In, My religion, Women's Wit and wisdom, and The song of the stone wall. In 1964, she was awarded the 'Presidential Medal of freedom' for her excellent service. It was presented by then-President Lyndon B. By Johnson. It is one of the two highest civilian awards in the United States. However, she died on June 1, 1968, in Easton, Connecticut, having done great service to the people and set a great example to the world, without both sight and hearing.

During this time period what I have felt is the happiness of life is fading away and the burden of life is following us due to this busy life pattern. But that condition was totally different for my younger brother and still the same. It is because he is the happiest member among five of my family. The reason for being the happiest one is being a Down's syndrome child. Down's syndrome is a genetic disease occurred due to the extra copy of 21st chromosome. However, I am heartily thankful for that extra chromosome that my younger brother gifted to the world as such a beloved one.

I was in grade 6 when he came to this world. Still I can remember him as a newly born child who was having an abnormally big but super cute belly. I have noticed that his smile which has been remaining unchanged since his birth until today. Just trust me please, his smile is unique and adorable!

We have unlimited words to communicate but are not used effectively. He has two three sounds which are similar to some words but he uses them properly to chat with us or to be friendly with someone else. But unfortunately, most of the outsiders take it just as a sound and neglect him because they are not capable of understanding him. If one day he can speak, definitely he will talk about so many things he had wanted to say for 13 years. And also he will definitely tell my secrets to my mama.

Normally, many people who meet him wherever look at him again and again as his appearance and behavior are bit unusual from others. But my brother smiles with those people without knowing that reality. At that time, I feel like I want to shout the world saying what he needs is not their pity but their love. But what he always gets is the pity. This is same for the other children born with specialties.

Ordinary people have used to call those children who were born with specialties as "disabled children". But I often question myself why we cannot rename them as "**children** who have special skills". It is crystal clear that they have plenty of





mental and physical disabilities but it is not fair enough to label them as **disabled**,

Sometimes, I get frustrated with this busy life. Then I wish I could be a Down's syndrome one like him. It is because he is always light as a feather. He has no worries until my mom wants to brush his teeth in every morning and evening. His world is not giant as ours but I swear that it is comfortable than ours.

He is not like us. But my parents wanted to give him an ordinary life as ours. I can remember how my mom put her best effort to look for a school where he could gain a general education as her other two children. Two children mean me and my sister. But her request was rejected by those schools all the time. In the end, the only thing that happened was that she got plenty of heart breaks. Finally, he was entered to a special unit where there were some kids like him. What I learnt is this society wants to pack their colourful world into a black and white box. Ordinary children are also among my brother's friend list. But every day they leave each other after the school interval. But those lovely kids hate goodbyes. My brother comes back to the special unit while those

children are going to their usual class. The wall between their two classes has divided them into two different worlds. Those kids proved to me that all adults including me are the responsible one for all the segregations in this world.

There are two teachers in my brother's classroom. They are well-trained teachers to teach children like my brother. They are the most calm-minded teachers I have ever met. To be honest, I do not like to be a teacher but once I have felt to be a teacher like them because their interesting teaching style can trigger someone to be a teacher. Once at a school concert, they danced with my brother's team on the stage to encourage them. I am grateful to the universe for introducing those kind hearted people to my brother's world.







