





INSIDE LOOK AT THE LIFE OF THE PIRATES



Leo Club of Uva Wellassa University is engaging with a project titled "Travelling Picco". The main objective of the project is to explore the natural beauty that Sri Lanka has and, promoting nature tourism and, to emphasise the importance of teamwork and friendship amongst its members.

Up until now, we have been able to visit different places like Katusukonda Mountain Range in Ella, Matara Beaches along the southern coastlines, and Bambarakanda Waterfall - one of Asia's highest waterfalls located near Haputale.

Journeys like these have incorporated challenges that provided opportunities to teach the members how to overcome obstacles with the help of each other and through teamwork. We hope to visit more exciting places in the future.

Situated amidst lush greenery in the Ella region lies Katusukonda – a mountain range renowned for its panoramic views. Katusukonda is a mountain overlooking panoramic views upon green landscapes. We were lucky to get breathtaking views at this place submerged in misty clouds during sunrise or sunset time with Travelling Picco project participants. The serenity of that scenery brought on the message of how everyone should be responsible for saving our environment by preserving such untouched beauty.

The further south our tour took us, the more beautiful beaches we met along the coastline of the district of Matara. Those beaches are known for their pristine shores, with coconut trees gently swaying against the blue waterscape. Apart from leisurely moments and the relaxation at the beaches in such picture-postcard locations, participating students were also encouraged about the marine ecosystem preservation efforts like avoiding littering or polluting coastal areas, to support a host of diverse aquatic life-forms, including coral reefs.

Standing right in front of this great fall, cascading to great depths into the crystal-clear pools below, having lush forests that are teeming with wildlife, it went a long way in driving home the point as to just how important it is to preserve wonders with fragile ecosystems around them so they remain intact for future generations to also be able to enjoy them.

Other than obtaining the excellent views of these visited areas, it was compulsory to all of us, the participants of the Travelling Picco Project, that each one of us had to actively help take good care of these beautiful environments without littering or supporting bad waste management. By simply keeping the protection of the environment at the forefront of all measures and embracing sustainable practices, the future is sure to go green. We may continue to do such initiatives that influence others to love and care for our world.

This Word is more popular in Sri Lanka. The island is a country with wide diversity of events those were originated in non-tourism context and some events initiated in tourism context. These events with their own unique appeal. In broader sense, event tourism in Sri Lanka can be divided in to two main categories as international and domestic event tourism with number of



The international event tourism mainly comprises from four subsets including MICE tourism, wedding tourism, heritage event tourism and sport event tourism. And conference tourism is an important sub category of the MICE tourism.

Sri Lanka has focused special attention on development of MICE tourism with facilities suitable for staging small and medium size conferences. SriLanka Convention Bureau is the government entity that responsible for promoting the country as a MICE destination. Sri Lanka was ranked in 71st place in the world and 17th place in Asia Pacific based on number of meetings organized in 2018

But the MICE Arrivals were decrease because of Ester Bomb Attack in 2019

Event TOURISM

The island was receiving popularity as a wedding destination in heritage festivals, only few of those events like Kandy Esala festival attract considerable number of international event tourists. Sport event tourism has not developed as a prominent contributor for the tourism industry, most probably, due to non-existence of major internationally recognized recurring sport events in the island. Conducting events at hotels like gala dinners, small heritage events and beach parties at tourism zones specially, during tourist season has become a norm in the hospitality industry.
