On February 4, 2025, Sri Lanka commemorated its 77th Independence Day, marking more than seven decades of freedom from colonial rule and celebrating the journey of a resilient nation that continues to move forward with pride and determination. The event was not just a tribute to history but also a powerful call for unity, equality, and progress under a fresh political era.

This year's celebrations were particularly significant as they took place under the leadership of President Anura Kumara Dissanayake, whose presidency reflects a new direction in Sri Lankan politics. 


#### WORLD SCOUT DAY
